"Christian Health and Wellness"

Last month I wrote about the importance of being spiritually fit as Christians as we live our lives in this world. I quoted John from his third letter and I do so again, "Beloved, I pray that all may go well with you and that you may be in good health, as it goes well with your soul." John is writing to Gaius. This could have been a leader in John's congregation or a layman. The point is that Christians in general need to be healthy, both spiritually and physically. This is what we would refer to as a wholeness approach. We as human beings are made up of both body and soul and in order for us to function to the capacity that God intends for us to function, our body and soul needs to be in good shape.

Last month I focused on the spiritual side of things. While this is of most importance, we should also be concerned about our physical well-being. I was told in one of my seminary classes that if I were to go to the hospital to visit a dying member and the elevator is out of order, I better be able to climb seven flights of stairs and be able to minister to my dying member when I get to the room. Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians 6:19, "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God?" We are to take care of our bodies. This includes staying in shape, watching what we eat, being careful with what we do with our bodies, etc.

Why is this important? First and foremost, we are reminded in that same Corinthians passage that our body is not our own. It is God's because we have been bought with a price. Second, we need to be physically in shape so that we can be ready in any circumstance to share the good news of Jesus with others. If we have to climb a mountain, a tree or a flight of stairs or rescue someone from a building or other dangerous situation, we need to also have enough energy and breath left to share the love of Jesus with them. It is vitally important that we take care of our bodies, both spiritually and physically.

May God give us the desire and passion to seek Him daily as we continue to share the message of our risen Savior with A Heart for Hamilton County and the World!



GOD'S GRACE FOR THIS GENERATION LAMP Ministry Inc — \$100,000

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy (1 Peter 2: 9-10).

For nearly 50 years, LAMP Ministry Inc. has ministered in northern Canada, where many villages are reachable only by aircraft or seasonal roads. Currently, nearly one million indigenous people live in these isolated areas with about half under the age of 14. The most alarming statistic is that over 15 percent of these children and youth will take their own lives out of despair and hopelessness.

Faced with the worldly influences and challenges of the internet and social media, and with limited opportunities for education and employment, the children and youth often feel despondent and discouraged. Sunday school, Christian youth programs, and regular worship services are rarely available.

Parents and grandparents of this younger generation were raised in residential schools away from home and the traditional family structure is non-existent. The younger generation lacks a sound model for parenting and family life.

On the Indian reserves, employment is limited, housing is limited, violence and drug abuse is higher than in most of the world, and life expectancy is between 45-55 years. LAMP goes into these communities offering the love of Jesus through parenting workshops, bereavement care training, VBS, Bible studies, and their testimonies of the hope found through faith in Jesus. The goal is to provide these communities with Christian education and witness to the Gospel.

To fulfill their mission of sharing the Gospel in the next few years, LAMP will need to expand their staff of full-time missionaries to four or five and recruit and train 100 to 200 more volunteer missionaries committed to serve at least five years.

This grant will provide funds to help LAMP reach the goal of hiring more missionary pilots and training more volunteers so that more communities can be reached with the love of Jesus and can be visited more than once a year. As the Gospel, our true source of comfort and hope, is proclaimed, local leaders are encouraged and built up to serve their own people. With the help of the Holy Spirit, the youth, knowing they are loved and cared for by the missionaries, will choose hope in Christ over suicide.

Music Notes By Gary Gromatzsky Angels We Have Heard on High

Angels we have heard on high Sweetly singing o're the plains, And the mountains in reply Echoing their joyous strains.

Gloria in excelsis Deo! Gloria in excelsis Deo!

Shepherds, why this jubilee? Why your joyous strains prolong? What the gladsome tidings be, Which inspire your heav'nly song?

Come to Bethlehem and see Him whose birth the angels sing; Come adore on bended knee, Christ the Lord, the newborn King.

Angels We Have Head on High 1855

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying: Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace, goodwill toward men! Luke 2:13,14 (NKJV)

"Les Anges dans nos Campagnes" was a French carol dating from the 1700s, which appeared in several different versions. It was published in English in 1862, the words saying:

> Angels we have heard on high / sweetly singing o'er the plains, And the mountains in reply / Echoing their joyous strains. Gloria, in excelsis Deo!

An older version had the title, "Harken All! What Holy Singing!" The words, translated into English, said:

> Hearken, all! What holy singing / Now is sounding from the sky! "Tis a hymn with grandeur ringing, / Sung by voices clear and high. Gloria, in excelsis Deo!

Still another primitive version speaks from the shepherds' vantage point, saving:

Shepherds in the field abiding, / Tell us when the seraph bright Greeted you with wondrous tiding, / What you saw and heard that night Gloria, in excelsis Deo!

Hymns are usually authored by human beings like us, but in this case obscure verses by unknown French poets were coupled with a refrain that was literally composed by angels in heaven: Gloria, in excelsis Deo. That's the Latin wording for the angelic anthem, "Glory to God in the highest!" It comes from Luke 2:14 in the Vulgate, the Latin version of the Bible. The Latin word *Gloria* means *Glory*, and *in excelsis* is the phrase for in the highest. Our English words excel and excellent come from the same root, meaning to rise or to ascend or to be on high. The Latin word Deo means God.

This was the song proclaimed by the angels over Shepherds' Field the night Christ was born. The musical score stretches out and emphasizes the words in a way that is uniquely fun to sing and deeply stirring, as we lift our voices to proclaim: Jesus has come! Hope has arrive on earth! A savior is born! Glory to God on High! Gloria, in excelsis deo!


