St. Paul Christian Academy Providing Christ-Centered Outreach

The Littlest and Least of These — St. Paul Lutheran Church and Christian Academy — \$42,000



"Let the children come to me; do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God" (Mark 10:14b). St. Paul Lutheran Church and Christian Academy in Dallas, Texas, located in a poor community of mostly unchurched families, offers Christ-centered early childhood education, before and after school care, and adult academic and Bible classes. St. Paul Lutheran Church is responding to the needs of families with a Christ-centered merciful outreach ministry. In a community dealing with intergenerational poverty and the challenges that come with it, the Christian Academy is available to help.

This grant is for the renovation of the fellowship hall of St. Paul Lutheran Church to better serve more children and adults in the Christian Academy. The Academy is planning to add on-site and online classes for young adults and parents in academic subjects, health and fitness, as well as Bible studies for new Christians. The grant allows for upgrades to the kitchen to meet state codes which will allow the feeding of the children daily – rather than relying on a catering firm – and to serve meals to parents, parishioners, and the community during special events.

By renovating this older building, the congregation and school can expand its preschool, infant care, before/after school education, and community outreach. It will provide functional space for classes and training programs such as: General Education Diploma (GED) classes, Computer Technology, English as a Second Language (ESL) classes, boys/girls mentoring, health and fitness training, job application and interviewing skills, healthy cooking classes, gardening, financial planning, parenting skills, as well as hosting Bible studies, satellite worship services, family fun nights, and other special programs and assemblies.

With its commitment to excellence, compassion, and faith, St. Paul members, volunteers, teachers, and staff can reach the community, helping change the lives of families by providing a safe and caring environment, healthy food, sound education, and the proclamation of the Good News of the Gospel.

Rev. Dr. Roosevelt Gray, Director, Black and African Missions, LCMS, stated: "Years of prayerful planning and faithful preaching led the congregation to establish St. Paul Christian Academy, the only Lutheran Christian Academy serving the historic Oak Cliff community and the lone African American congregation in LCMS Texas District with a Lutheran Christian Academy."

Away in a Manger 1887

Away in a manger, no crib for a bed, The little Lord Jesus laid down His sweet head.

The stars in the sky look down where He lay,

The little Lord Jesus, asleep on the hay.

The cattle are lowing, the baby awakes.

But little Lord Jesus, no crying He makes.

I love Thee Lord Jesus, look down from the sky,

And stay by my cradle till morning is nigh.

Be near me, Lord Jesus; I ask Thee to stay

Close by me forever, and love me, I pray.

Bless all the dear children in Thy tender care.

And take us to heaven to live with Thee there.

Music Notes by: Gary Gromatzky This is commonly known as "Luther's Cradle Hymn." But did the great German Reformer, Martin Luther, really write the words? Did he sing them by the cradle of his little son, Hans? This is a great mystery in hymnology.

In 1887, "Away in a Manger" appeared in a little book of songs entitled <u>Dainty Songs for Little Lads and Lasses</u>, published in Cincinnati by the John Church Company. The songbook was compiled by James R. Murray. A notation beneath "Away in a Manger" said Luther's Cradle Hymn (Composed by Martin Luther for his children and still sung by German mothers to their little ones.) Only stanzas one and two were given.

"Away in a Manger' quickly became American's favorite children's carol, the words being sung to forty-one different tunes! Everyone assumed the poem had been written by the great Reformer, Martin Luther.

Then in 1945, Richard Hill published a fascinating article entitled "Not So Far Away in a Manger" in which he announced he had discovered the first two stanzas of "Away in a Manger" in an 1885 songbook entitled <u>Little Children's Book</u>, published by German Lutherans in Pennsylvania. No authorship was given. Nor could Hill find any appearance of this carol in German church history or in Luther's works.

After extensive research, Hill concluded: "It seems essential to lay [aside] once for all the legend that Luther wrote a carol for his children, which no one else knew anything about, until it suddenly turned up in English dress 400 years later in Philadelphia. Luther can well afford to spare the honor." But he adds, "Although Luther himself had nothing to do with the carol, the colonies of German Lutherans in Pennsylvania almost certainly did."

So the mystery endures. Who wrote "Away in a Manger?" There were apparently two unknown writers: A German Lutheran in Pennsylvania who wrote the first two stanzas, with another unknown author adding a third verse which first appeared in an 1892 songbook published by Charles H. Gabriel.

Well, who cares? Certainly not the generations of children around the world who have come to love and know the little Jesus through this sweet carol, and who have gone to sleep praying:

I love Thee, Lord Jesus; look down from the sky And stay by my cradle till morning is nigh.


