"2020 Vision"

The elders and I would like to highly encourage all of us to make an intentional effort to gain better spiritual vision in 2020. Whether it is making sure you have your personal/family devotions or bringing your family to Sunday school and Bible class on Sunday mornings or attending our men's Bible study on Thursday mornings, we want to encourage you in your faith life. Then we will be equipped as a congregation to carry out the mission of the church—to reach out and spread the love of Christ in our community and to individuals who are hurting and desperately need to know the forgiveness and life that Jesus has for all who believe in Him.



Mission Grant Story . January 2020

GOD'S HEALING POWER AND GRACE

Lutheran Church of Guatemala and Child Beyond International — \$100,000

Guatemala is a beautiful country, called "The Land of Eternal Spring" because of the pleasant climate. However, many people suffer in extreme poverty. Over 50 percent of the children are malnourished and have no access to any form of medical or dental care. Over 65 percent live in poverty. Most children have no pre- or post-natal care and often die from preventable diseases.

Immanuel Lutheran Church, Hood River, Oregon, and the Lutheran Church of Guatemala have partnered to share God's physical and spiritual healing with as many souls as possible in the decades to come. Rev. Abdiel Orozco, Bishop of the Lutheran Church of Guatemala, and his brother, Rev. Elry Orozco, are doctors. They have developed a network of LCMS partner churches that sends medical professionals and mission teams to Guatemala on short-term mission trips.

In order to reach isolated villages, they need the right tool, namely a Mobile Medical Mercy Mission Bus called the "4M Bus." This grant will be used to purchase and retrofit a bus with medical equipment and provide the sanitary area needed for medical and dental procedures in remote and

inaccessible villages. Along with physical care, a group of non-medical missionaries will offer Bible school classes and worship services for both children and adults.

"And the King will answer them, Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me" (Matthew 25:40).

Subsequently, the local Lutheran churches will follow up with each person served through the medical clinic, enabling thousands of Guatemalans to experience God's healing power and grace, both physically and spiritually.

The one-day bus clinics will be held monthly in three selected communities surrounding Lutheran churches beginning in 2020 and continuing indefinitely. Additionally, monthly one-day clinics for up to three additional communities will begin in 2021. When the grant funds are received, less than four months should be needed for the bus to be purchased, retrofitted, and stocked for use by the medical mission teams to share the love of Jesus with the people of Guatemala.

Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits: who forgives all your iniquities, who heals all your diseases. Psalm 103:2-3

J. C. Penney, who descended from a long line of Baptist preachers, was well on his way to establishing a successful career when the 1929 Great Depression threw him into crisis. His business deals turned sour, and Penney became overwhelmed with anxiety and insomnia. He developed a painful case of shingles and was hospitalized, but tranquilizers and drugs only made things worse. His mental state deteriorated until, as he later said, "I was broken nervously and physically, filled with despair, unable to see even a ray of hope. I had nothing to live for. I felt I hadn't a friend left in the world, that even my family turned against me."

But one morning he heard singing coming from the little hospital chapel. The words of the song said, "Be not dismayed whate'er betide / God will take care of you."

Entering the chapel, he listened to the song, to the Scripture reading, and to the prayer. "Suddenly—something happened. I can't explain it. I can only call it a miracle. I felt as if I had been instantly lifted out of the darkness of a dungeon into warm brilliant sunlight." All worry left him as he realized more fully than he had ever imagined just how much the Lord Jesus Christ cared for him. From that day J. C. Penney was never plagued with worry, and he later called those moments in the chapel as, "the most dramatic and glorious twenty minutes of my life." He later became one of America's greatest retail merchants.



On a Sunday in 1904, Civilla Martin was in Lestershire, New York, where her husband, Walter, was compiling a collection of hymns for the Practical Bible Training School. They were planning to travel to another town that day, for Martin had a preaching assignment. Civilla woke up sick, and Martin was about to cancel his plans, when their young child piped up and said: "Oh, Daddy, you don't have to stay home because of mother—God will take care of us."

Martin proceeded to the train station and fulfilled his appointment, When he returned, Civilla handed him the words of "God Will Take Care of You," which she had written in his absence. Going to his little organ, Martin composed the music, and it was first published in the songbook he was compiling for the school.
