"Your Kingdom Come"

This is the theme for this year's Lent series. As we begin the season of Lent, our midweek services are going to be centered around themes drawn from the book of Zechariah. The prophet's chief concern is God's kingdom. Throughout all fourteen chapters, Zechariah joyfully and profoundly announces that God's kingdom is coming through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The book of Zechariah abounds with stunning portraits of our Savior. Jesus serves as the prophet's interpreting Messenger throughout the first six chapters. Zechariah calls Jesus a "Shoot" (3:8; 6:12), Servant (3:8) and "Stone" (3:9). It is in the last six chapters, though, that the prophet describes Jesus in much more compelling ways. Jesus is righteous and humble (9:9). The blood of his covenant sets prisoners free (9:11). He is the church's Cornerstone, Tent Peg and Battle Bow (10:4). Then, in a dramatic twist of fate, Christ is detested (11:8), sold for thirty pieces of silver (11:12), struck so his sheep scatter (13:7) and finally pierced and killed (12:10). In the end, however, God's kingdom comes – finally and permanently, in pristine beauty (14:9, 16, 17).

Last month I wrote about our 2020 Vision. The elders and I would like to encourage all of you to make an effort to attend our Wednesday evening services during Lent. This is another way for us to strengthen our faith and intentionally take steps to deepen our understanding of God's Word. It is also a time during the middle of the week that we can be surrounded by fellow believers in Jesus Christ to support and encourage each other in our faith and in our walk in this life.

May God give us the desire and passion to seek Him daily as we continue to share the message of our risen Savior with A Heart for Hamilton County and the World!








MEN'S CLUB

GOD'S GRACE AND RESTORING HOPE Restoring Hope for Detroit Children and Families Camp Restore Detroit — \$100,000

Camp Restore New Orleans has been a beacon in the city of New Orleans for many years, providing hope, restoration, and care to the people affected by hurricane Katrina. The devastation caused by that hurricane is very similar to what is seen when driving through some of the streets of Detroit today. It's clear there has also been a disaster there — an economic disaster — with ruins similar to that of New Orleans. Detroit residents call it "a hurricane without water." Families live in areas where adjacent yards, sidewalks, and building foundations sometimes can't be seen due to the overgrowth of weeds and debris. With low population numbers and declining real estate values, it is difficult for the city to provide services that many of us take for granted. Camp Restore Detroit (CRD) was created as a ministry of Mt. Calvary Lutheran Church, an LCMS church located in the middle of the disaster-ridden Ninth Precinct.

In May 2017, the first "campers" (volunteers) began arriving. They partnered with local community leaders to restore hope to this area, while being fed and housed at Mt. Calvary. The volunteers have cleared hundreds of lots, boarded up countless houses, and served at nursing homes, food banks, and sport centers as they worked with local leaders. Watching God work through these people has been powerful. An uplifting, cooperative relationship has been established among Camp Restore personnel, Mt. Calvary members, and people in the community. With the encouragement of the city of Detroit, CRD purchased, at a minimal cost, lots adjacent to the church which included two abandoned houses. Camp Restore Detroit has requested funds to help renovate these houses into Christ-centered community outreach centers and community gardens, where lives of children and families can be changed.

This mission grant will provide funds to transform these abandoned houses in the community into places where families, children, and other adults can enjoy hearing the Gospel in a safe setting, while engaging in personal growth activities that bring joy, creativity, education, and hope back into their lives.

Alas! And Did My Savior Bleed 1707

But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. Galatians 6:14

After his graduation from college, Isaac Watts returned to Southampton, England, and spent two years writing hymns for Above Bar Congregational Church. He then moved to London to tutor children in a wealthy family of Dissenters. While there he joined Mark Lane Independent Chapel. Soon he was asked to be a teacher in the church, and in 1698, he was hired as associate pastor. There, on his twenty-fourth birthday, he preached his first sermon. In 1702, he became senior pastor of the church, a position he retained the rest of his life. He was a brilliant Bible student, and his sermons brought the church to life.

In 1707, his *Hymns and Spiritual Songs* was published. Isaac had written most of these hymns in Southampton while in late teens and early twenties. Included was a hymn now considered the finest hymn ever written in the English language. It was based on Galatians 6:14: "But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ." Originally the first stanza said: *When I survey the wondrous cross/Where the young Prince of Glory died* ... In an enlarged 1709 edition, Watts rewrote the lines to say: *When I survey the wondrous cross / On which the Prince of glory died*, */ My richest gain I count but loss, / And pour contempt on all my pride*.

Also included in the 1707 hymnbook was "Heavenly Joy on Earth," better known today as, "Come, We That Love the Lord," or "We're Marching to Zion."

Another hymn was "Godly Sorrow Arising from the Suffering of Christ," better known as: "Alas! And Did My Savior Bleed." This hymn later played a major role in the conversion of a great American Hymnist. In 1851, Fanny Crosby, 31, attended a revival service at John Street Methodist Church in New York. "After a prayer was offered," she recalled, "they began to sing the grand old consecration hymn, "Alas! And Did My Savior Bleed" and when they reached the third line of the fifth stanza, 'Here, Lord, I give myself away,' my very soul was flooded with celestial light."

How right that Watts should, long after his death, play a part in winning to Christ the author of a new generation of hymns and gospel songs!


Isaac Watts has certainly touched the hearts of millions through the centuries. After drawing the stark contrasts between the sacrificial death of the mighty Maker and the unworthiness of the sinful creature, he concludes with the consecration, "Here, Lord, I give myself away — 'tis all that I can do."

As we enter into Lent I pray that we all will remember the suffering and death that our Savior went through to save you and me from our sins.


