#### "I Have Seen the Lord"

These are the words that Mary Magdalene shared with the disciples after her personal encounter with Jesus on the day He was raised to life. We are not told what their response was to this news. What we do know is that the disciples were together the evening of that first day of the week in a room with the doors locked in fear of the Jews. Did the disciples fully comprehend what had taken place? Ι would venture to say that they had not. As Marv Magdalene had an encounter with Jesus outside the tomb, the disciples had a personal encounter with Jesus in that room when appeared before them even though the doors were locked. Jesus' words to them was, "Peace be with you."

We deal with some of the same uncertainties that Mary and the disciples experienced. They did not know what had happened to Jesus, which caused even more uncertainty and anxiety. But you can sense the relief when Jesus speaks Mary's name to her and when He stretches out His hands and tells the disciples, "Peace be with you." Those personal encounters made all the difference in the world for Mary and the disciples.

I think it is safe to say that we have not physically had a personal encounter with Jesus in the way that Mary and the disciples did. However, we do have personal encounters with Jesus that brings us relief in the challenging times that we live in. Jesus personally comes to us through His Word. He comes to us in a real physical way with His body and blood in the Lord's Supper. We have a personal encounter with Jesus every time we speak to Him in And He does for us the same thing He did prayer. for Mary Magdalene and the disciples; He brings us relief of stress and anxiety and brings us peace in as we live our everyday lives. These personal encounters with Jesus can and do make all the difference in the world for us.

May God give us the desire and passion to seek Him daily as we continue to share the message of our risen Savior with A Heart for Hamilton County and the World!



### 2019–2021 LWML MISSION GRANT #9 Mission Grant Story • April 2020

#### WIND RIVER INDIAN RESERVATION TRANSPORTATION Fort Washakie, Wyoming — \$40,000

With the purchase of a church building near Fort Washakie in the spring of 1978 by the LCMS Wyoming District, the mission work with the Shoshone and Arapaho Native American tribes began. A large part of this ministry is focused on outreach to the children of the Wind River Indian Reservation. Due to the distance from their homes and with transportation options being limited, very few children are able to attend the Bible classes in Fort Washakie and Crowheart. A suitable vehicle will enable the children to continue the 88-mile round trip to Fort Washakie to Sunday school and the 60-mile round trip to Crowheart for the "Monday" school. These classes are the mission's best, and in most instances, the only, opportunity to share the Gospel of Christ with the children living on the Reservation.

The children of this high-poverty ethnic area receive few or no opportunities for Christian education. Often, there is little involvement from the parents in their children's education, and they make no effort to attend church. However, the parents grant the Wind River Lutheran Mission (WRLM) staff permission to pick up their children and take them to Sunday school or VBS. There they learn about Jesus, and the children become Christ-bearers, shining their light and pointing their families to the Savior.

In order to accomplish this work, funds are needed to purchase a reliable passenger van for the children's transportation. A van, rather than a school bus, is preferred, as van drivers are not required to obtain a special license. Your support of Mission Grant #9, the Wind River Indian Reservation Transportation at Fort Washakie, Wyoming, is greatly appreciated.

*Music Notes By Gary Gromatzsky* Great Is Thy Faithfulness

Great is Thy faithfulness, O God my Father, There is no shadow Of turning with Thee; Thou changest not, Thy compassions they fail not; As Thou has been Thou forever wilt be.

Summer and winter And springtime and harvest, Sun, moon and stars In their courses above; Join with all nature In manifold witness, To Thy great faithfulness, Mercy and love.

Pardon for sin And a peace that endureth, Thine own dear presence To cheer and to guide; Strength for today And bright hope for tomorrow, Blessings all mine, With ten thousand beside.

#### Great Is Thy Faithfulness 1923

Your mercy, O Lord, is in the heavens; your faithfulness reaches to the clouds. Psalm 36:5

The author of this hymn, Thomas Obediah Chisholm, was born in a log cabin in Kentucky. At age 16, he began teaching school, despite the paucity of his own education. He came to Christ at age 27 under the ministry of evangelist H. C. Morrison. But Chisholm's health was unstable, and he alternated between bouts of illness and gainful employment in which he did everything from journalism to insurance to evangelistic work. Through all the ups and downs, he discovered new blessings from God every morning. The third chapter of Lamentations became precious to him: *His compassions fail not. They are new every morning; Great is Your Faithfulness* (Lamentations 3:22-23)

Thomas later admitted there was no dramatic story behind the writing of "Great is Thy Faithfulness." While serving the Lord in Vineland, New Jersey, Thomas sent several poems to his friend, musician William Runyan, who was so moved by this one that he prayed earnestly for special guidance in composing the music. Runyan was in Baldwin, Kansas, at the time, and the hymn published in 1923 in Runyan's private song pamphlets.

"It went rather slowly for several years," Thomas recalled. Then Dr. Will Houghton of the Moody Bible Institute of Chicago discovered it, and would say in chapel, "Well, I think we shall have to sing "Great is Thy Faithfulness." It became an unofficial theme song for the Institute; and when Houghton died, it was sung at his funeral.

Still, it remained relatively unknown until popularized around the world by George Beverly Shea and the choirs at the Billy Graham Crusades.

Thomas spent his retirement years in a Methodist Home for the Aged in Ocean Park, New Jersey, where he was frequently seen walking by the ocean and along town streets. Tom Rich, a resident of Ocean Park, recalls his pleasant demeanor as he dropped by the diner, sat on park benches, and fellowshipped with friends at Ocean Park's summer Bible conferences.

Thomas died in Ocean Park in 1960. During his lifetime he wrote 1200 poems and hymns. In addition to "Great is Thy Faithfulness," he is the author of the well-known "O To Be Like Thee," and the hymn "Living for Jesus."

Living for Jesus, a life that is true, Striving to please Him in all that I do; Yielding allegiance, glad hearted and free, This is the pathway of blessing for me.
