How much money does it take to save lives?

Is \$35,000 enough? What about \$70,000?

Why such specific dollar amounts? Well, because that how much potential funding St. John has to save lives, and we are making big plans to use these funds for that purpose.

What am I talking about?

Let me explain:

Years ago, St. John was given about \$100,000 worth of stock for the purpose of supporting pro-life causes in and around Hamilton. Over the years the value has grown to almost \$200,000. Every year our church gets dividends which we've been saving up in a checking account. Those dividends currently equal about \$35,000. But this year the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (the national church body we belong to) has a grant available that matches dollar for dollar any monies a local congregation spends for pro-life purposes. This grant gives us the possibility to double our money and turn the \$35,000 into as much as \$70,000! What an incredible blessing and opportunity.

The deadline for us to apply is in July. We are making big plans for how we can use this money and how we can involve the congregation. Abortion is a great moral evil that plagues our culture. Our nation needs more churches and Christians to stand up, speak out, and offer real solutions. Currently, St. John is considering supporting the pregnancy crisis center that operates in Waco, right across from the Planned Parenthood.

Every Tuesday and Thursday, the Planned Parenthood in Waco performs abortions (about 100 each day!) But the pregnancy crisis center offers 24-hour options for women who might reconsider. In January, it was estimated that the center prevented more than 100 abortions, because Christian counselors standing outside the Planned Parenthood were able to direct women to the Crisis Center where these expectant mothers were given life-affirming and life-preserving options for their baby.

Death should never be an option for a baby!

Please pray about this and our efforts as a church to support life in our area. And keep an eye out for more announcements. I am hoping to do some field trips and other activities to engage the congregation in this cause. And if you'd like to contribute to increase our funds, let me know. We can apply for up to \$50,000 in matching grants through the synod.



Eastern European countries continue to emerge from the darkness of oppressive regimes

In Martin Luther's homeland and the nearby Czech Republic, most German and Czech people do not know Christ as their Savior. The Czech Republic is considered one of the most atheistic countries in the world. LCMS Mission Development Counselor Gary Thies stated, "Under communist domination of the Soviet Union, Bibles were restricted and now the people are eager to hear about Jesus. The challenge is great, but God has sent wonderful pastors, teachers and missionaries to reach out to the people of this country that are in darkness." Scripture tells us,

Your word is a lamp unto my feet and a light to my path (Psalm 119:105).

The Lutheran Church is striving to meet the urgent need to bring the love and light of Christ to people who have been living in spiritual darkness.

Recently, many immigrants and refugees from the Middle East have settled in Germany. Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty! Early in the morning Our song shall rise to Thee. Holy, holy, holy! Merciful and mighty! God in three Persons, Blessed Trinity!

Holy, holy, holy!
All the saints adore Thee,
Casting down their golden
crowns around the glassy sea;
Cherubim and seraphim
Falling down before Thee,
Which wert, and art,
And evermore shall be.

Holy, holy, holy! Though the darkness hide Thee.

Though the eye of sinful man Thy glory may not see. Only thou art holy; There is none beside Thee, Perfect in power, In love and purity.

Holy, holy, holy!
Lord God Almighty!
All Thy works shall praise Thy name
In earth, and sky, and sea.
Holy, holy, holy!
Merciful and mighty!
God in three Persons,
Blessed Trinity!

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY Reginald Heber

Holy, Holy! is a Christian hymn written in the early 1800s by Anglican Bishop Reginald Heber (1783-1826). Heber was serving as vicar in Hodnet, Shropshire, England, (1807-1823) a period in which the author was prolific, writing more than 100 hymns, many having survived to modern times. It was first published posthumously in A Selection of Psalms and Hymns for the Parish Church of Banbury (Third Edition, 1826). And thereafter by the writer's widow in Hymns Written and Adapted to the Weekly church Service of the Year (1827), one of the first hymnals to group their hymns by the liturgical occasion within the church year.

It was published when Anglican authorities disapproved of the singing of hymns in churches, other than metrical psalms, although there was considerable informal hymn-singing in parishes. Heber originally intended to win support for their inclusion. It is considered Heber's best known and most widely used hymn and remains popular in many denominations.

The text speaks specifically of the Holy Trinity, having been written for use on Trinity Sunday. It is an example of Heber's dutiful attempt to avoid excessive emotionalism. A defining characteristic is that the text does not "initiate praise", but is rather an invitation to join in an endless song. Additionally, every single line rhymes with the initial "holy".

It has a wide scope, successively referencing humans, saints, angels and all living creatures, and its main theme is the "basic belief in the Trinity", which is shared by most denominations of the Christian church despite other differences. The first stanza opens with an invitation to worship God in the morning. The second stanza magnifies the opening idea, with saints joining in "adoring the Majesty in heaven". The third stanza describes some attributes of the Christian deity, while the final stanza is a climax of the preceding with "earth and sky and sea" joining in praising the divine. Variants to the original text in modern hymnals are relatively minor, mostly found in usage by non-Trinitarian groups such as the Mormons.


