



Music Notes By Gary Gromatzky

Come, Thou Almighty King, Help us Thy name to sing, Help us to praise; Father, all glorious, O'er all victorious, Come, and reign over us, Ancient of Days.

Come, Thou Incarnate Word, Gird on Thy mighty sword, Our prayer attend; Come, and Thy people bless, And give Thy word success; Spirit of holiness, On us descend.

Come, Holy Comforter,
Thy sacred witness bear
In this glad hour;
Thou who almighty art,
Now rule in every heart,
And ne'er from us depart,
Spirit of power.

To the great One in Three, Eternal praises be Hence, evermore! His sovereign majesty, May we in glory see, And to eternity, Love and adore!

COME, THOU ALMIGHTY KING

Come, Thou Almighty King is a hymn for which we have little or no background. Although it is one of the best known English hymns, we do not even know who wrote it. The text first appeared in a little pamphlet in 1757, together with a hymn by Charles Wesley. It too may be a Wesley hymn, but no hymnologist has ever claimed that it is.

Some churchgoers who sing these words frequently may not have noticed that this is a Trinity hymn. Each of the first three stanzas is addressed to a different member of the God-head, and the last stanza to "the great One in Three." The first verse speaks to God the Father, our Almighty King, and is a prayer that He will help us to sing His praise. The last phrase mentions a name of God which is given in Daniel 7:22. "Ancient of Days" speaks of God's eternity, his timelessness. He has always existed and He will always exist.

The second stanza, addressed to God the Son, reminds us of the opening words of John's gospel' "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." Here is a prayer to Jesus Christ who is God incarnate, God in the Flesh. Yes, Christ came the first time to be our Redeemer; He will come again to be our Judge.

The third stanza is a prayer to God the Holy Spirit, the Holy Comforter. The name here actually means "Paraclete" (Advocate or Lawyer) because the Holy Spirit represents Jesus Christ, now that the Son has returned to His Father in heaven. One of these lines reminds us that it is the Holy Spirit who "beareth witness with our Spirit, that we are the children of God." Another phrase declares that, although God's Spirit is almighty, He can only rule our hearts when we allow Him to do so.

The truth of the Trinity, that God is One yet Three or "One in Three," cannot fully be understood. Many scholars have tried to probe its mystery and to express it in words. One of them, a certain Joseph Dare, has said: "Steam is water, and ice is water, and water is water; these three are one."

Each kit should contain:


- 1 light-weight bath-size towel (20x40" to 52-x27"), dark color recommended

- 1 adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging.
- 1 sturdy comb (no picks or fine toothed combs); remove packaging
- 1 metal nail clippers (attached file optional). Remove packaging.

The Word Takes Flight

Propelling the Gospel LAMP Ministry Inc. — \$65,000



By awesome deeds
you answer us with
righteousness,
O God of our
salvation, the hope

Lutheran Association of Missionaries and Pilots (LAMP) ministry focuses on taking the Gospel to Indigenous People in northern Canada. LAMP ministry began in 1970 and the LWML has been an ongoing help to this ministry. Each year, hundreds of volunteer missionaries from the United States travel to remote areas to teach Vacation Bible School (VBS) to thousands of children using transportation provided by LAMP.

Currently there are nearly one million Indigenous People who live in isolated areas of northern Canada. These areas can only be reached by aircraft or seasonal roads. The number of local clergy and missionaries has declined dramatically and there is currently an entire generation of children and youth who have not been taught the Holy Scriptures and the hope that is theirs through Jesus. LAMP takes missionaries and volunteers into northern Canada to share the Gospel.

LAMP ministry uses small airplanes to get missionaries to these remote places. They depend on two aircraft to accomplish their mission. While the aircraft are older models — 1977 and 1979 — they are still extremely sound and dependable. These airplanes are required to have yearly inspections to make sure they are properly maintained and have received all the updates and requirements needed to keep them airworthy.

Technology is ever changing in our world today and the world of aviation has seen numerous advancements in avionics. Global Positioning Systems (GPS) have become a standard and the newer Wide Area Augmented System (WAAS) and the recent completion of the Aireon space-based air-traffic surveillance system have increased the safety and efficiency of avionic components. These types of avionics are necessary components for the pilots who fly out of the United States and into Canada.

The older avionics systems in these two airplanes need to be replaced. With this grant the two airplanes used by LAMP ministry can be upgraded and modernized to help ensure the safety of their pilots, missionaries, and volunteers as they propel the Good News to people living in remote areas of North America.
