Dear St. John Family,

The fall season is shaping up to be a very exciting time for our congregation.

First of all, sometime in September, we hopefully will be hearing back from the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, Million Dollar Life Match Grant. We've applied for \$50,000 to match the \$50,000 we have in our own Endowment for Life. These funds will help us purchase a new ultra-sound machine for Care Net Pregnancy Center in Waco. On September 14, Care Net will be coming to Hamilton with their 40 ft RV and trailer, all loaded down with diapers, wipes, formula and so much more. St. John will be partnering with them to distribute these items to pregnant women and mothers with young children. We'll also have the opportunity to pray with all who come to receive these services. Between now and September 13, St. John is collecting diapers (sizes 3,4,5,6) and Similac Advanced or Similac Sensitive formula. (See page 10 for more details)

St. John Preschool is also another part of our congregation that has lots of exciting things happening this fall season. First of all, we've been blessed to hire on a new director and several new teachers and aids who have been busily preparing for school for several weeks, already. Preschool begins August 29. And to start of the new year with a bang, the preschool also has a brand new paint job, which looks amazing! Also, because of a \$225,000 grant, our school will be updating all of it's technology, enhancing the playground, helping pay for paving the parking lot, potentially adding a new covered drive by the preschool entrance, upgrading all the doorways for better security and safety, and a host of other projects. We've also been able to give away 3 full-tuition scholarships to 3 families who otherwise couldn't have afforded to send their child to a Christian Preschool. God has sure blessed our preschool ministry immensely and our enrollment is up 30% over last year.

Also, at the special voter's meeting on August 21, St. John voted to pursue calling an associate pastor from Concordia Seminary in St. Louis. This process won't be complete until the end of April, when the seminary announces which congregations will be receiving a new pastor-graduate. God-willing we'll be blessed to receive a talented young pastor, who can work alongside me to serve our growing ministry in Hamilton, and especially work to further develop our children's and youth ministry and build relationships with the families who have children in our preschool. This is a big commitment on the part of St. John and I ask that you pray for this process often.

As always, there's lots of other good news that I could report... but hopefully you're seeing it in person anytime you're on the church campus and in worship. I thank God every day when I come to work because I get to be a part of all of it. I love serving Jesus and His church and all of you!

There is hope in your future, says the Lord, Jeremiah 31:17 (As told by Gloria and Bill Gaither)

When Bill and I started our family in the sixties, racial tensions were tearing the country apart. Civil rights activists had suffered and some had been killed. The Vietnam conflict was claiming thousands of lives, and tensions boiled over on university campuses. Many young people were growing disillusioned and "dropping out."

In this climate, Bill and I sought to write songs with lasting answers to the turmoil of the human spirit. But in the fall of 1969, several things happened to test the reality of our own convictions. We realized we were expecting another baby. Though we had always intended to have another child, we weren't planning on a baby so soon. My body hadn't quite recovered from the last pregnancy. Making matters worse, Bill contracted mononucleosis, which left him exhausted and depressed.

This combination of national turmoil and personal trouble discouraged us, and we occasionally asked each other, "If the world is like this now, what will it be in fifteen or sixteen years for our baby? What will this child face?"

Discouraged and disheartened, they looked for signs of hope. One day in the spring, Bill walked out of his office to inspect a newly paved parking area. Construction workers had covered it with several coats of asphalt. Bill was satisfied with the job that was done, but as he turned, he noticed a tiny blade of grass poking through the layers of rock and tar to reach into the sunlight. Remembering the blade of grass that prospered and while pondering and praying about these things, we came to realize anew that our courage doesn't come from a stable world, for the world has never been stable. Jesus Himself was born in the cruelest of times. No, we have babies, raise families, and risk living because the Resurrection is true!

Our baby arrived safe and sound, and we named him Benjamin, which means "most beloved son." A few weeks later "Because He Lives" was born in our hearts and poured from our souls.

Over the years this song has reassured us that our Lord's Resurrection is the central truth of life. Because He lives, we can face tomorrow. Many times since, as our children grew, our business-life changed, our fortunes shifted, or our direction clouded, our family has found assurance in this very personal song.

It's "our song," but we're grateful others have loved it, too.



Helping Single, At-Risk Moms Choose Life Through the Love of Jesus.

Redeeming Life Maternity Home, Illinois Expansion Redeeming Life Outreach Ministries Grant Entity — \$100,000



Redeeming Life Outreach Ministries operates maternity and transitional homes for single, at-risk mothers in Florida. The opportunity has arisen to use their successful model to expand into the northern Illinois area. Illinois has some of the most liberal abortion laws in the country. In 2018, 42,441 babies were killed by abortion in this state, an increase of seven percent from the previous year (Illinois Department of Health).

Expanding Redeeming Life's reach to the Chicago area will save women and babies by offering single, pregnant women in crisis an option to choose life for their unborn children.

The success of Redeeming Life maternity homes is dependent on the nurture, mentorship, and life skills learning offered to the residents by a caring deaconess, devoted to their spiritual care. Residents learn to cook, parent, run a household, create and live within a budget, finish their education, and find a way to become self-sufficient. Most importantly, residents are shown the unconditional love of our Heavenly Father with ample opportunities to grow in love, security, and faith in Jesus, many for the first time.

Essential to the success of the women is the nurturing and mentoring by a professional church worker who guides the residents on a daily basis. While teaching life skills and supporting residents in furthering their education and/or job skills is a vital part of what Redeeming Life does, the heart of the ministry is Jesus Christ, crucified and risen. As an organization with RSO status in The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, Redeeming Life may call rostered workers.

This mission grant will help Redeeming Life Outreach Ministries support a called deaconess to serve in the Chicago area. With the loving ministry of a deaconess, the needs of the residents, especially in the area of critical spiritual care, will be met. In addition to providing funding for diaconal service, the grant will help offset costs during the first two years, offering a safe and stable home (rent, utilities, food) and will provide program services for the women living there.
