## SESSION 15

*Review from Last Week*

- 1 What ultimately is the temptation that leads Eve, and then Adam, to eat of the forbidden fruit?
- 2 Aside from the obvious, what else is meant in verse 7 that Adam and Eve "knew" they were naked?

*Read Genesis 3:8-19*

- 3 What are some ways that Adam fails to be a Christ-like husband as described in Ephesians 5:25-33?
- 4 The big problem of Chapter 3 is more than just a problem with of a bad choice or a piece of fruit. It is a relationship problem. What is the cause of this relationship problem?
- 5 Martin Luther first asserted--and it is generally agreed upon by theologians--that God cursed the serpent more for Adam and Eve's benefit than for any other reason. Explain why?
- 6 Typically, whenever the Bible speaks of "seed" as a reference to offspring or descendants, It refers to the seed of a man. Indeed, in the most technical sense, women don't have "seed". Given this, how is it most certainly the case that this strange prophecy points specifically to Christ?
- 7 Besides learning about the reality of death and full consequences of death, the other consequences that Adam and Eve face as a punishment for their sin, is God cursing the creation. What did this entail and why would God the creation?

*Read Genesis 3:20-26 & 4:1*

- 8 Is the Lord's act of making clothes for Adam and Eve an act of Law or Gospel?
- 9 In 4:1, notice Eve's excitement at giving birth to Cain. What hope and faith might she be expressing?
